afterlife	The belief (in some religions) of life after death.
judgement	To make considered decisions or come to sensible conclusions.
reincarnation	The rebirth of a soul in another body.
secular	Something that is not connected to religion (non-religious).
bereavement	The period of grief and mourning after a death.
traditions	The passing of customs of beliefs between generations

Key Knowledge

Christians, Hindus and Muslims believe that if you repent and try to change your life and do good things, God will forgive you and wash away all of your sins.

Humanists believe that human beings shape their own lives and have the responsibility of shaping their own lives in a way that is good.

Muslims believe that God is telling them how they should live their lives through the Qur'an.

Reading stories and exploring how God was with people through difficult and unexpected situations, helps Christians to trust God and to know how He wants them to live.
