Humanism	Humanism is a non-religious ethical outlook on life that looks to science and other evidence to understand the universe and holds that issue of 'right' and 'wrong' can be explained by human nature	- Christians believe in one God. They try to follow Jesus' two great commandments: Love God and Love your neighbour as their code for living. - Humanists believe they can be good without God. - Humanists have a code for living. - A code for living is the moral principles and values people choose to live their lives by.
