Key Vocabulary

hard lines	This describes a line which is well defined. These lines are thicker and darker.
soft lines	This describes lines which might be a little fuzzy. These lines are thinner and lighter.
perspective	The size which something appears depending on how close or far away it is.
blending	Slightly smudging two colours together to create a gradual change from one to another

- Draw with pastel and crayon.

KS3 - to use a range of techniques to record their observations in sketchbooks.

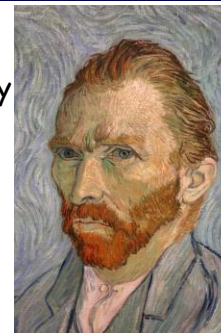
Key Facts

- Depth is important when creating art as it makes a piece more realistic.

- An artist can use multiple resources to draw, each having their own effect on a viewers mood and the look of the finished artwork.

Vincent van Gogh - was an impressionist painter born in the Netherlands who became a hugely famous artists in history after his death. In only a decade, Van Gogh created more than 2,000 works of art.
