Key Vocabulary

collage	A piece of art made by sticking different materials such as pieces of paper or fabric onto a backing.
texture	The feel, appearance of a surface.
overlapping	Covering something partly by going over its edge.
organic shapes	Shapes which are imperfect and are slightly different from each other.

Key Skills

- Use repeated pattern in a collage.
- Gather and sort the materials needed.

Key Facts

- Collage is an art style which includes sticking materials onto a 2D (flat) surface.
- For collage, you can use paper, wool, newspaper, photo graphs, bubble wrap, pipe cleaners etc.
- Mixed Media is a term used to describe artworks composed from a combination of different media or materials.

Influencing Artist

Ben Mosley - an expressive artist from Britain. He is known for his work which is based on architectural and sporting themes. Also, he is an official artist for Team GB.
