

<u>Winter Nursery Rhymes</u> Sing/say together the following nursery rhymes: <u>Snow, snow, falling down</u> Snow, snow, falling down Soft white flakes all round the town. Catch one on your mitten warm, Winter's here — a snowy storm! and <u>The North Wind</u> The north wind doth blow, And we shall have snow, And what will the robin do then, Poor thing? He'll sit in a barn, And keep himself warm, And hide his head under his wing, Poor thing!	<u>Build a Snow Person</u> Can you build a snow person, can you make different sizes? What will you use for the eyes, nose, button? Can you give them names? 	<u>Birds</u> Birds find it really hard to find food when it snows. Can you make a bird feeder? A simple idea is to thread hooped cereals onto some string or a piece of ribbon. Hang it in your garden or outside a window for the birds to enjoy on this snowy day.
<u>Reading</u> Snuggle up and read your favourite book.	Snow Day Home Learning Activities for EYFS 	<u>Snow and Ice</u> Talk about what ice feels like. If you have cubes of ice could you put them in different places around your house. (By a radiator, in the fridge, on the doorstep, on the kitchen table, in the garden?) Which do you think will melt the first? Do you know why? <u>Snowballs</u> Can you make 5 different sized snowballs and then put them in order of size from the smallest to the biggest.
<u>Winter in your Garden</u> Talk about what happens during the season of Winter. (Bare branches, no sign yet of animals who are still hibernating, the weather is get colder, we wear warm clothes). What signs of Winter do you see?	<u>Make Snowflakes</u> Fold paper and cut snips on the different sides. Unfold to see what different snowflakes you have made.	<u>Winter Art</u> Could you paint/draw a winter picture? Can you tell one of your family members what you know about winter?
