

Why does Christmas matter to Christians?

Key Vocabulary

God	Christians believe in one God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit
Christian	Someone who has a relationship with Jesus Christ and believes in God
Bible	A religious book, which has many different Jewish and Christian stories
parable	A simple story with deep meaning told by Jesus
advent	The arrival of something new
Incarnation	Christians believe that Jesus became man and God

Key Knowledge

- Christians believe that Jesus is God and that he was born as a baby in Bethlehem.
- The Bible points out that his birth showed that he was extraordinary (for example, he is worshipped as a king, in Matthew) and that he came to bring good news (for example, to the poor, in Luke).
- Christians celebrate Jesus' birth; Advent for Christians is a time of getting ready for Jesus' coming.

What is Christmas and how do we know Christmas is coming?

Which signs of Jesus' story can be seen at St Simon and St Jude's church in the run-up to Christmas?

Which colour vestments will Reverend Castle wear at this time of year, and why?

What are most Christians thankful for, at Christmas time? How does this compare to you?
