Do you live in a town or a village?

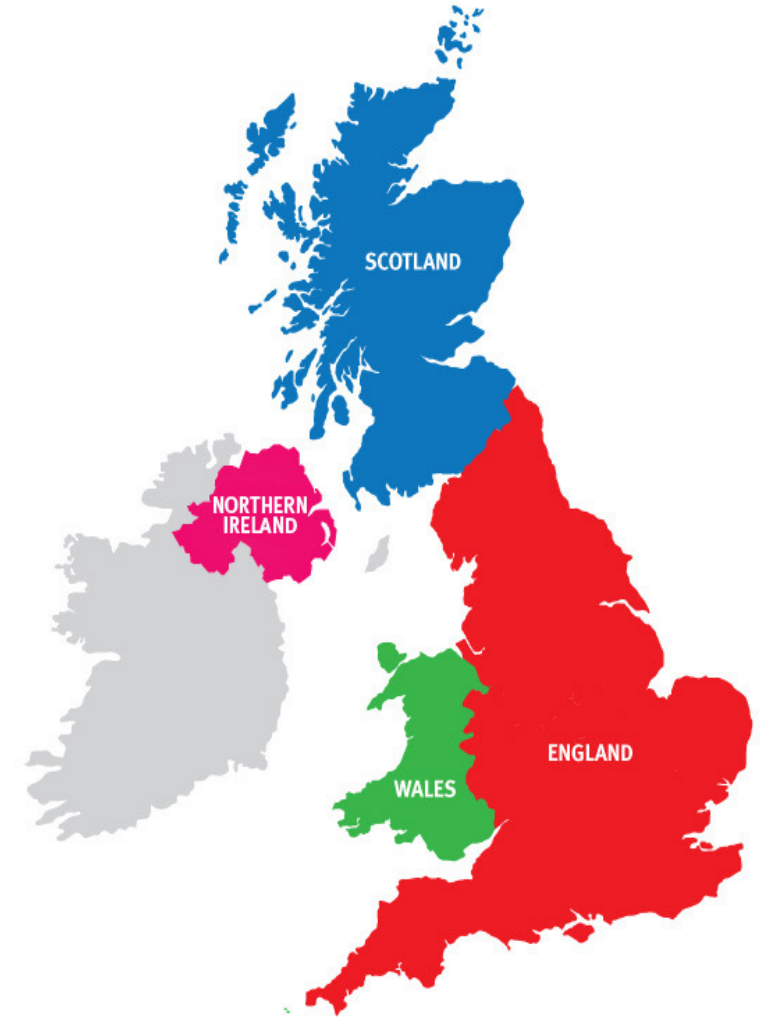
