copyright	This gives its owner the exclusive right to copy and distribute a creative work.
embed	To insert something into something else, e.g. a picture into a piece of text.
hyperlinks	A link embedded in one document which takes you to another document.
navigation bar	A part of a webpage that has links to other parts and helps the user navigate the site.
HTML	The Hypertext Markup Language is the standard for documents to be written in for web pages.

- **January 1st, 1983** is considered the official birthday of the Internet. Prior to this, the various computer networks did not have a standard way to communicate with each other.
- Google is the world's most visited website. The word Google comes from the term 'googol', which is the number one followed by a hundred zeroes.
- The first ever website went live on April 6th 1991.
