emergency	Something that is very serious and needs the help of the Police, Fire or Ambulance service.
address	The house that you live in.
current	A strong pull from underneath rivers and the sea.
rules	Instructions that you need to follow to stay safe.
choking	Having something stuck in your throat that stops you breathing.
flood	When rivers break their banks and cover land areas in water.
hailstones	Small pieces of ice that fall from the sky. They can cause damage to cars and buildings.

- If you need help, you should dial 999.
- You should never play near open water like lakes and rivers.
