Why is the word 'God' so important to Christians?

During this half term the children have learnt about what Christians believe about God and Creation. They have learnt that for Christians the word 'God' is important as the name of someone very special, the Creator of the universe and all that is in it, including people and animals. The children have also learnt that Christians gather in a place of worship called a church. We also explored Harvest and how this is celebrated by Christians.

Exploring bible stories

We heard 'The Creation Story'. The children learnt that God created all the animals and creatures in the sea. Even the jellyfish.



Places of worship and Harvest

The children learnt that Christians gather in a place of worship called a church. We then explored how the Harvest festival is celebrated. The children then painted their own fruit and vegetables during 'Messy Church'.

The children explored the idea of 'special' through the story of 'The Precious Pearl'. We then linked this idea to how, for Christians, the word 'God' is important as the name of someone very special. The children decorated the word 'God' to make it look special.
