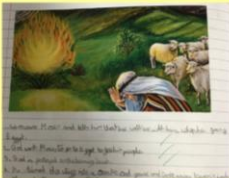
We began our learning by comparing three religions and discussing what people believe in God. We also worked in groups to compare art from different religions.
