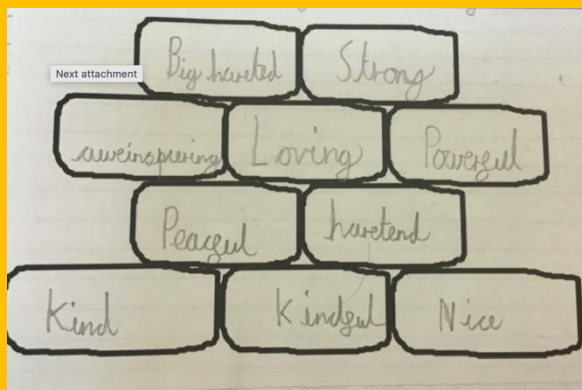

The parable of the Mustard seed - Mark 4:30-32

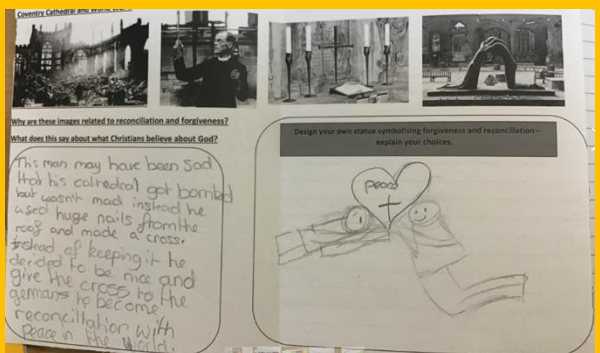
What does it mean if God is holy and loving?

During this half term the children have been learning about what we mean when we describe God as holy and loving. We have explored different sacred texts to look at the way different individuals describe God, specifically focusing on the words that they use. We have focused on how Christians believe that God is omnipotent, omniscient and eternal and that is why God is worth worshipping. We have also looked at the different way Christians show their beliefs through music and architecture.

We have explored the different ways that we would use to describe God and then looked in different texts to explore how others describe God.



We have spent time discussing how cathedral architecture represents God's qualities. We have focused specifically on Coventry Cathedral and how they used the cross of nails to show forgiveness and reconciliation.



After looking at different sacred texts, Christian architecture and religious vocabulary, we created our own stained-glass windows drawing upon different symbols, images, words and pictures that we would use to represent God's holiness and lovingness. We also chose an object to draw to represent God and labelled his different characteristics.
