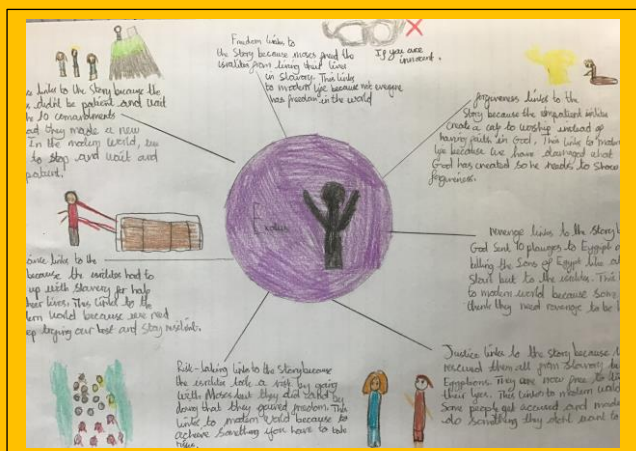

The parable of the Mustard seed - Mark 4:30-32

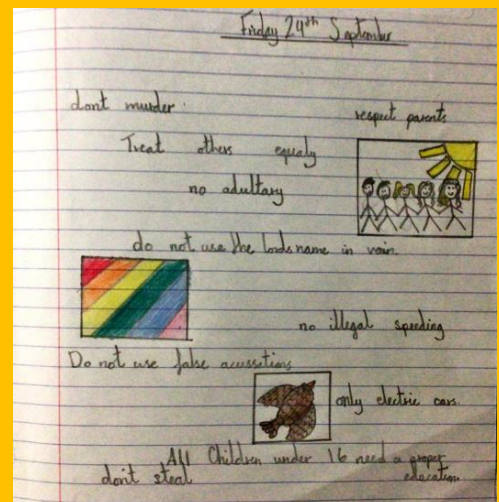
How far does following God bring freedom and justice?

They have considered Moses' actions, together with his thoughts and feelings, and how these relate to freedom and justice. Extending their learning further, the children have discussed how the People of God encourages all Christians to make the right choices through following God and right the wrongs that have gone before.

Year 6 have also considered how these beliefs may be relevant within the world today and how Christians and Christian organisations seek to ensure freedom and justice for everyone, in the UK and around the world.
