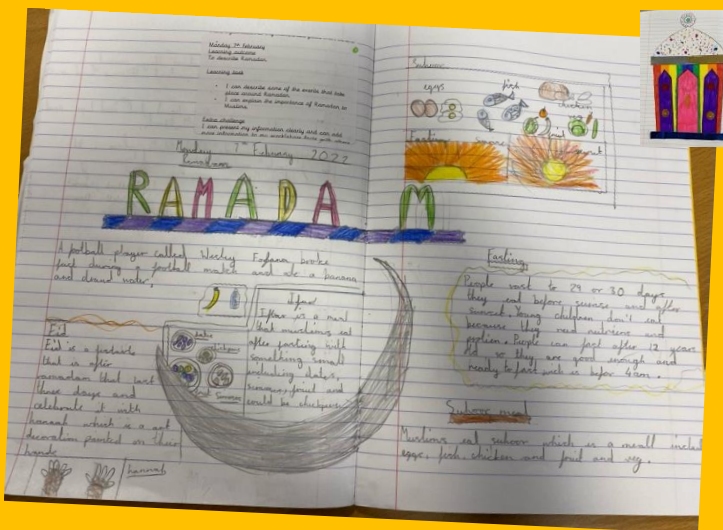

The parable of the Mustard seed - Mark 4:30-32

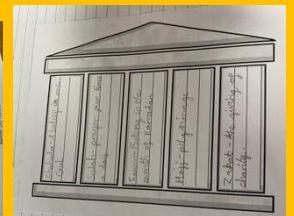
What does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today?

During this half term the children have been learning about what it means to be a Muslim in Britain. We have learnt about the five pillars of Islam and the children have been able to link their learning to these pillars. We have had some interesting discussions and have enjoyed our learning.

We have also produced fact files about Ramadan and Eid.



When learning about Zakhat, we discussed the role of charity and how one of the pillars of Islam is focused around helping/supporting others. We had an interesting debate about whether it should be the role of the government or the individual person to support others. The children decided that, whenever possible, we should all support other people.



We also spent some time looking at the Qu'ran and discussing its importance and how Muslims take care of the Qu'ran. Children then explained how they take care of their most valuable possessions. We also explored the place of worship and labelled some key features of a mosque.
