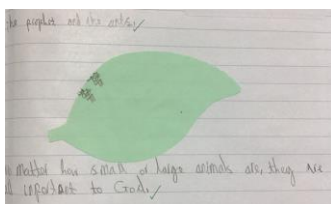
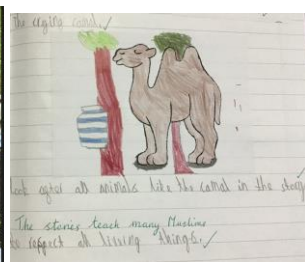
The parable of the Mustard seed - Mark 4:30-32

Who is Muslim and how do they live?

During this half term we have continued learning about the faith of Islam. The children have listened to and discussed how stories about the Prophet show what Muslims believe about Muhammad (PBUH).

Who was the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) and why is he important to Muslims?

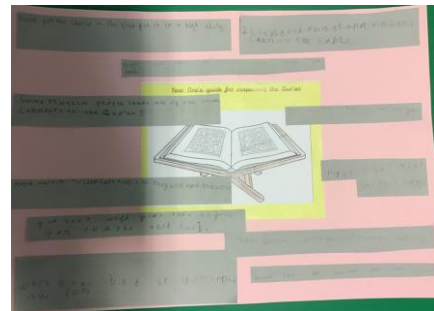
During this half term the children have listened to two stories. The children had the opportunity to retell the stories and to understand the message. Year one then began planting and have understood the respect needed in order to care for all living creatures. Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) cared for all animals even tiny ants and he forbade cruelty to any animals. He cared for animals himself in order to show others how to do this, we learned about this in the story about the camel.



What can people learn from Muslim holy words?

The children learned about how Muslims treat the Holy Qur'an and how it is a guide to help Muslims live their lives.

Together Year One made a simple guide for treating the Qur'an which they shared with Year Four because they are also learning about Islam.



What difference does worshipping God make to Muslims?

The children have learnt about the importance of prayer to Muslims. Salah is the required Muslim prayer and the second pillar of Islam. Salah happens five times a day. The children made a clock to see when this would happen. They marked on Dawn, Mid-day, Late afternoon, Sunset and Night time.
