



Key Vocabulary

prophecy	Prophecy is a divine message from God and prophets are chosen for different reasons
Old Testament	A collection of books that were written before the life of Jesus
Messiah	A title given to the person believed to be the saviour, who has been chosen to bring salvation to humankind
Immanuel	The name of the Messiah, often represented as Jesus Christ
advent	It means 'coming' and it's the period before Christmas

Key Knowledge

- Jesus was Jewish.
- Christians believe Jesus is God in the flesh.
- They believe that his birth, life, death and resurrection were part of a longer plan by God to restore the relationship between humans and God.
- The Old Testament talks about a 'rescuer' or 'anointed one' — a messiah.
- Christians believe that Jesus fulfilled these expectations, and that he is the Messiah. (Jewish people do not think Jesus is the Messiah.)
