

Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'?

Holy Week	The week before Easter, starting on Palm Sunday
Easter	An important festival from the Christian church
Easter Sunday	When Jesus was resurrected from the dead
Good Friday	The day Jesus died
resurrection	When Jesus rose from the dead
last supper	The final meal Jesus had with his disciples

Key Knowledge

- Christians see Holy Week as the culmination of Jesus' earthly life, leading to his death and resurrection.
- The various events of Holy Week, reminds Christians of God's sacrifice of his son, and also God's love for his people.
- Christians today trust that Jesus really did rise from the dead, and so is still alive today.
- Christians remember and celebrate Jesus' last week, death and resurrection.

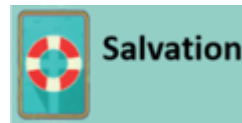
