Key Knowledge

- Many Christians try to extend the Kingdom of God by challenging unjust social structures in their locality and in the world.

What would the Kingdom of Jesus look like?

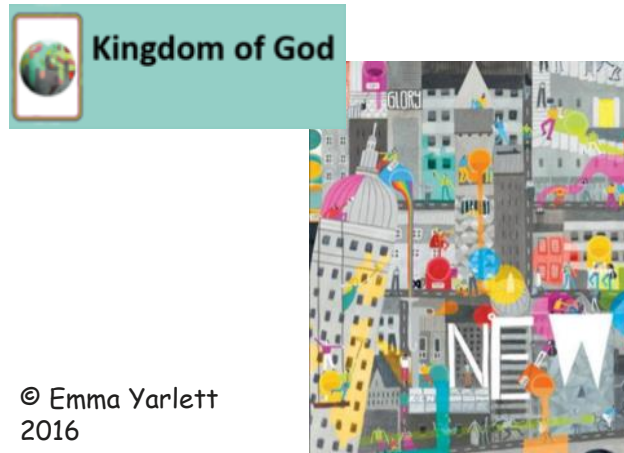
Who would be allowed into the Kingdom of Jesus?
